Notes

Once a bustling bakery and later an artist's studio, this early 1900s building reborn as a luminous arts center and private venue, merging Brooklyn's industrial past and contemporary minimalism. Its adaptive reuse, led by architect Jorge Zapata, offers expansive modern design for large-scale events.

The venue's three floors provide an open canvas for productions, exhibitions, and private gatherings. Features include: oversized windows frame sweeping views of the East River and Manhattan skyline, exposed columns, skylights, and wood beams.

Events can range from intimate to grand: from standing receptions of up to 220 guests, to seated dinners for 120, or theater-style seating for 180. The soaring ceilings, dramatic grand staircase, and flexible open floor plan allow each experience to be staged as a work of art.

Twice a year, the walls transform with curated art exhibitions, infusing the space with the spirit of the neighborhood's creative community.
